Here's information regarding reporting routes:

Norfolk Constabulary -

- Contact the police by reporting <u>online</u>, calling **101** or calling Crimestoppers anonymously on **0800 555 111**. <u>In an emergency, or if you witness a crime in progress or believe someone is in imminent danger then call **999**.</u>
- It's important not to refer the matter to OPT via council contacts. By calling 101/999 an incident record is completed, and a risk assessment is carried out to ensure appropriate resources are allocated. Such records can also be used later when composing evidential timelines.
